Policy of the Week: Code of Conduct

The Policy: There is a thorough policy on this topic. It mentions complying with the law. It says that abusive or dangerous activities will not be tolerated. But the primary intent of the policy is that "the rights of all members and patrons must be respected".

The Intent: to maintain a community of consideration. This can be carried out in many ways. It can mean stepping all of the way outside of the Market if you have to smoke. It can mean making every effort to contain products that have a fragrance. It means planning your display so that it does not block the booths on either side. It means arriving on time. It means staying until 5 pm and planning your path out of the Market so that others' ways aren't blocked. It also means being careful in speech and the written word as we discuss internal issues with folks who are not members of our community. Nega-

tive talk reflects on the Market as a whole.

The Respect: All of our agreements have respect at their core. When you leave a week of working alone in your studio and come into the city, you become a part of something. Thank for your constant vigilance to the overall vision.

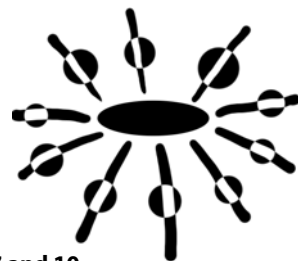
