## Eugene Celebration Preview

This year's Eugene Celebration will take place one week earlier than last year, Sept. 4-6. This is also Labor Day weekend. As always, this will have a variety of impacts on our Market, AND there are major changes from our usual Celebration schedule. Here are the details:

**ONLY ONE Day of Market:** the Market will be open Saturday, Sept. 5, 10 am - 5 pm, and the Food Court and stage will be open until 6:30 p.m.

**Check in Early Saturday:** Due to the Parade, check in and booth assignment will happen one hour early on Saturday, check in by 7:30!!

**Community Causeway:** This year, the Community Causeway will fill South and West Park Streets, ONLY around the West Park Block, This will cause significant challenges to load in and load out on the West side, so plan to be patient and flexible.

**Be in the Parade:** Kim always loves to have some company in the Parade, we are part of the award win-
