## Metal Forks Replace Plastic in the Food Court

Metal forks now replace plastic forks at Food Court food booths. The forks are washed and re-used each week. This will keep approximately 4,000 plastic forks out of the landfill every week! Please be careful to place your used forks in the buckets provided at all trash/composting stations to reduce loss and replacement costs. If you have extra forks you'd like to donate to the cause, you can put them in any fork bucket.
